Climate change - in the form of rising temperatures, less predictable rainfall and more extreme weather events - is likely to affect Bangladesh in coming decades, and will have a direct bearing on agriculture and food security. Climate change hits hardest at the most vulnerable in society, including the rural poor and landless. Adaptation measures are needed to support these groups, as well as those farmers who are moving into more commercial operations. This session will aim to identify the main thrusts of a new food security Country Investment Plan and highlight some of the key options for climate change adaptation in agriculture.
