EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Smart Bangladesh

The ambitious socio-economic plan laid out by Bangladesh in the 2021-41 perspective plan implies that Bangladesh will need to make the journey from 'Digital" to 'Smart" which essentially means becoming focused on data centric design and human centric experience rather than automation & digitization. The ERD will play a vital role through its various services of economic relations in achieving the Smart Bangladesh Vision and will strive on the 4 key pillars: **Smart Citizen, Smart Government, Smart Society and Smart Economy**. Action across these 4 pillars will ensure that Bangladesh collectively achieves the objective of creating an innovation economy for Bangladesh through fostering stronger economic relations with bilateral and multilateral development partners and facilitating all government agencies in effective implementation of their projects and programs.

- Smart Citizen: This pillar will aim at empowering the citizens of Bangladesh with a digital
 first mindset through driving campaigns and implementing widespread digital literacy
 programs. Smart citizens of 2041 will not only have digital embedded in their way of life
 but will also collaborate with the govt. and industry for co-creation of services and policy
 making.
- Smart Government of 2041 should be able to bring to life the concept of "invisible governance" through implementation of 100% paperless offices and hyper personalized service platforms across priority areas like healthcare, education, agriculture, revenue management, public security etc. It will engage in proactive and collaborative policymaking to catalyze Bangladesh's evolution on frontier technologies.
- Smart Society will essentially be characterized by inclusive communities and sustainable
 living. Digital tolerance, ethics, and values will be embedded among citizens. High degree
 of inclusivity will be enabled through interoperable cashless payment ecosystem, easy
 access to credit etc. and life will be sustainable & resilient in smart cities, energized by
 smart grids and boosted by an integrated technology platform.
- Smart Economy will be about creating an innovation economy to enable Bangladesh to be on the fore front of ever evolving industrial technology revolution through creating a robust startup ecosystem. It will position Bangladesh to build on its current industrial strengths and become technology fore-runners in the same.

INTRODUCTION TO ECONOMIC RELATIONS DIVISION

Background of Economic Relations Division (ERD)

After the great independence of Bangladesh, the Father of the Nation Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujibur Rahman established the External Resources Division on January 31, 1972, as one of the functional units under the Planning Commission. Because of the growing importance of economic cooperation with various development partners, on January 16, 1976, the External Resources Division was commissioned as a full-functioning Division under the Ministry of Planning. Later, considering the relation of external resources mobilization to the income-expenditure plan of the government, the External Resources Division was reconstituted again as a Division under the Ministry of Finance on October 16, 1978. In October 1990, the Government decided to change the name of the Division from External Resources Division to Economic Relations Division.

ERD is one of the four Divisions of the Ministry of Finance (MoF), Government of the People's Republic of Bangladesh. ERD is responsible for mobilizing the external resources for the socio-economic development of Bangladesh. This division leads as the focal point of the Government for interfacing with the development partners as well as for coordination of all external assistance inflows into the country. It assesses the need for external assistance and devices strategies for negotiations, mobilizes international development assistance, formalizes and enables development assistance mobilization through the signing of loans and grants agreements and determines and executes external economic policy.

Major Functions of Economic Relations Division

ERD is responsible for mobilizing the external resources for the socio-economic development of Bangladesh. This division leads as the focal point of the Government for interfacing with the development partners as well as for coordination of all external assistance inflows into the country. It assesses the needs of external assistance, devises a strategy for negotiations and mobilizing foreign assistance, formalizes and enables aid mobilization through the signing of loans and grants agreements, determines and executes external economic policy.

According to the Allocation of Business, among the Different Ministries and Divisions (Schedule 1 of the Rules of Business, 1996) the functions of ERD are as follows:

- 1. Assessment, mobilization, negotiation, and allocation of all multilateral and bilateral economic international development assistance for implementation of development projects under Annual Development Plan, Five-Year Plan, and other relevant development plans.
- 2. Examination and scrutiny of proposals for international development assistance (Loans, grants, etc.) received from Ministries/Divisions for allocation and identification of sources thereof.
- 3. Mobilization, negotiation, and allocation of external assistance relating to food and commodity assistance from bilateral and multilateral sources.

- 4. Co-ordination and processing for approval of all technical assistance programmes including assessment of requirement of negotiation with bilateral development partners and multilateral agencies.
- 5. Policies and co-ordination of matters relating to employment of Bangladeshi nationals as experts and consultants in international development assistant projects.
- 6. Policies and procedures for appointment of expatriate consultants and technical assistance experts.
- 7. Guidelines and procedures for tendering involving funds provided under external aid.
- 8. Co-ordination, review, and monitoring of the utilization of internal development assistance.
- 9. Foreign debt management including debt profiling and budgeting, debt servicing and maintenance of accounts thereof.
- 10. Matters relating to periodic meetings with development partners including preparations thereof and follow up actions.
- 11. Foreign exchange budgeting (other than cash foreign exchange budgeting) in respect of development imports including bridge financing for project/ commodity assistance.
- 12. External economic relations with the international development agencies/partners.
- 13. Policy matters related to external assistance from Non-Government Organizations (NGOs) including foreign voluntary agencies and philanthropies.
- 14. All international agreements involving financial economic and technical co-operation: Joint Commission/Joint Economic Commission, Joint Economic Committee, Economic and Technical Co-operation Agreements, etc., dealing predominantly with economic and financial issues.
- 15. Liaison with Resident Missions of Multilateral Agencies and bilateral development partners.
- 16. Administration of Economic Wing of Bangladesh Missions abroad and appointment of officers and staff thereof.
- 17. External Economic Policy: Matters relating to economic and technical cooperation between developing countries and between developed and developing countries, especially issues of development finance, transfer of resources, external debt technology transfer.
- 18. Preparation of briefs and materials on financial and economic questions relating to Bangladesh's participation in the UN and allied organizations, Commonwealth Conference, Non-allied Conference, Organization of Islamic Conference, South Asian Association for Regional Cooperation (SAARC), etc.
- 19. Fellowship and Foundations:
 - i. Programming and Management of fellowships, scholarship and foreign training offers from bilateral and multilateral sources including liaison with Asia Foundation, Ford Foundation, British Council, IRDC, ADC and so on.
 - ii. Liaison with Allocation Committee, Selection Committee VII particularly Ministry of Public Administration and other Ministry/ Division concerned.
 - iii. Offer of technical assistance by Bangladesh.
- 20. Secretariat administration including financial matters.

- 21. Administration and control of subordinate offices and organization (if any) under this Division.
- 22. Liaison with International Organizations and matters relating to treaties and agreements with other countries and world bodies relating to subjects allocated to this Division.
- 23. All laws on subjects allotted to this Division.
- 24. Inquiries and statistics on any of the subjects allotted to this Division.
- 25. Fees in respect of any of the subjects allotted to this Division except fees taken in courts.
- 26. Appointment to executive position of different international development organizations.
- 27. Setting up of Host Country Office of international development agencies in Bangladesh.

Organizational Structure

The Secretary, Economic Relations Division (ERD), is the head of Administration and the Principal Accounting Officer of this division. ERD functions through its 10 (Ten) wings based on specific areas of responsibility. The Wings are:

CONTEXT AND PHILOSOPHY

Context

Honorable Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina announced that Bangladesh will turn into a 'Smart Bangladesh' by 2041. As per the direction of the HPM, the government has taken initiatives to build a 'Smart Bangladesh'. In doing so, the government is planning to make Bangladesh a developed country where a higher economy, advanced technology, and a new nation will be established by the year 2041. Every citizen will be skilled in using technology, economic activities will run through using technology, the government will be technologically smart, the whole society will be technologically smart, and Bangladesh will be a Smart Bangladesh. ERD too, has taken the bold initiative to produce its own 'Work Plan' to contribute to this glorious goal. It has made a target, for itself, to develop a 'Smart Bangladesh Work Plan of ERD' as an integral part of its innovation work plan for the period of 2023-2024. To realize this target ERD already organized four workshops on the four pillars of the Smart Bangladesh i.e. Smart Citizen, Smart Government, Smart Society and Smart Economy during the October 2023 to January 2024. And with the outcomes of these four workshops and one national level stakeholder consultation and feedback Seminar in February 2024, this very document has been prepared.

This document has been developed as per the guidance of the HPM and by following the guidelines developed by the a2i of the ICT Division. This is a living document and will be continuously updated as and when necessary.

Philosophy

In developing this work plan, ERD has considered and deeply pondered on the existing policies and plans of the government viz. 8^{th} Five Year Plan (July 2020 – June 2025), Perspective Plan of Bangladesh (2021 – 2041), Delta Plan 2100, ICT Master Plan 2041 along with the global agendas like Sustainable Development Goals 2030 etc. In doing so, ERD kept its footing firm on the business responsibilities that have been allocated to it and avoided sincerely the possibilities of overstepping the responsibilities of other government agencies.

This work plan premises that we need to set up Bangladesh as a knowledge-based economy and innovative nation. Therefore, ERD will facilitate projects and programs to build an inclusive digital society and bring backward marginalized people into the mainstream of development. It will continue to support enterprise-based businesses and investment-friendly start-ups to contribute to the growth of small, cottage, small and medium enterprises to ensure continuous employment generation. And to do so, ERD will focus on —

- a. more integration of systems,
- b. more efficiency and effectiveness of service delivery mechanisms,
- c. more transparency and accountability of services and service providers,

Vision 2041

The main document that is thriving the towards realization of the Smart Bangladesh is none but the 'Making Vision 2041 a Reality: Perspective Plan of Bangladesh (2021 – 2041). The government adopted Vision 2041 as a continuation of Digital Bangladesh Vision 2021 and seeks to take the nation to the development path dreamt by Bangabandhu. Specifically, Vision 2041 seeks to eliminate extreme poverty and reach Upper Middle-Income Country (UMIC) status by 2031, and High-Income Country (HIC) status by 2041 with poverty approaching extinction. The Plan underpins two principal visions –

- a. Bangladesh will be a developed country by 2041, with per capita income of over USD 12,500 in today's prices, and fully in tune with the digital world; and
- b. Poverty will become a thing of the past in Sonar Bangla.

These can only be realized by increasing the productive capacity, building an innovative knowledge economy, and protecting the environment to ensure rapid inclusive growth to eliminate poverty. According to this Plan, the following strategic goals will be pursued as the essential components of economic policy over the long-term:



Eradication of Extreme Poverty by 2031; reducing Poverty to less than 3 percent by 2041



Towards Upper middle-income country by FY 2031; High-income country by 2041



Industrialization with export-oriented manufacturing will drive structural transformation into the future



Paradigm shifts in Agriculture will enhance productivity and ensure nutrition and food security for the future



A Service sector of the future will provide the bridge for the transformation of the rural agrarian economy to a primarily industrial and digital economy



The Urban transition will be an essential part of the strategy to move to a high-income economy



Efficient Energy and Infrastructure will be essential components of the enabling environment that facilitates rapid, efficient and sustainable growth



Building a Bangladesh resilient to climate change and other environmental challenges



Establishing Bangladesh as a knowledge hub country for promoting a skill-based society
