

47. Annex-A: COMMONLY USED TERMS IN INTERNATIONAL DEVELOPMENT COOPERATION¹

Accountability Obligation to demonstrate that work has been conducted in compliance with agreed rules and standards or to report fairly and accurately on performance results vis a vis mandated roles and/or plans (DAC).

Activity Actions taken or work performed through which inputs, such as funds, technical assistance and other types of resources are mobilised to produce specific outputs (DAC).

Addis Ababa Principle All donor assistance should be delivered through government systems unless there are compelling reasons to the contrary; where this is not possible, any alternative mechanisms or safeguards must be time-limited and develop and build, rather than undermine or bypass government systems (Strategic Partnership with Africa, 2001).

Aid Modalities The way donor support is channelled to the activities to be funded. A basic distinction can be made between 1) budget support (which is integrated into the national budget of the recipient country and used according to national public expenditure management rules and procedures), 2) parallel support (which is kept separate from the general resources in the national budget but should still be reflected in the national budget, and which is used according to rules and procedures that may be more or less in conformity with those laid down in the national public expenditure management system), and 3) in-kind support (which enters the recipient country in the form of goods or services). The term "aid modality" is often used interchangeably with "aid instrument".

Aid Instrument Sometimes used interchangeably with "aid modality" (see the above definition). Examples of "aid instruments" are Sector Programme Support (SPS), Sector-wide Approach (SWAp), Mixed Credit, soft loan, bilateral technical adviser, etc. Aid instruments may operate through either one modality (e.g. bilateral advisers, which are one type of in-kind support) or more modalities (e.g. SPS, which in principle may comprise both budget support, parallel support, and in-kind support) as defined above.

Alignment Donors base their overall support on partner countries' national development strategies, institutions and processes (Paris Declaration).

Appraisal An overall assessment of the relevance, feasibility and potential sustainability of a development intervention prior to a decision of funding (DAC).

Assumptions Hypotheses about factors or risks, which could affect the progress or success of a development intervention (DAC).

Audit An independent, objective assurance activity designed to add value and improve an organisation's operations. It helps an organisation accomplish its objectives by bringing a systematic, disciplined approach to assess and improve the effectiveness of risk management, control and governance processes (DAC).

Base-line Study An analysis describing the situation prior to a development intervention, against which progress can be assessed or comparisons made (DAC).

Basket funding Basket funding is the joint funding by a number of donors of a set of activities through a common account, which keeps the basket resources separate from all other resources intended for the same purpose. The planning and other procedures and rules governing the basket fund are therefore common to all participating donors, but they may be more or less in conformity with the public expenditure management procedures of the recipient government. A basket may be earmarked to a narrow or a wider set of activities (e.g. a sector or a sub-sector). The term "pool(ed) funding" is sometimes used instead of basket funding (Danida).

Benchmark Reference point or standard against which performance or achievements can be assessed (DAC).

Budget Support/ General budget support: Financial support from a donor that is channeled into the general treasury account of a recipient country where, as an integral part of the resources herein, it co-funds the national budget. The support is thus not earmarked, and it is used according to the national public expenditure management rules and procedures.

Sector budget support: Financial support from a donor that is channeled into the general treasury account of a recipient country where, as an integral part of the resources herein, it co-funds the national budget of a particular sector. The support is thus nominally earmarked, and it is used according to the national public expenditure management rules and procedures (Danida).

Complementarity (often also referred to as division of labour). Donors divide sectors and thematic areas among themselves with a view to avoiding the crowding of donors in particular sectors and areas. The consequence will usually be that donors end up focusing on a relatively limited number of areas or sectors and sometimes have to even disengage from some areas or sectors. The Nordic Plus donors have formulated a set of complementarity principles. The key principle is that the Nordic+ donors will be guided by the partner country in the division of labour and the selection of areas/sectors. (Nordic+).

Conditionalities Stipulations, or provisions, that needs to be satisfied.

Cross-cutting Issues. Denmark has identified three cross-cutting issues, which must be considered in all preparation and implementation of programmes and projects: a) promotion and strengthening of gender equality; b) promotion of environmentally sustainable development; and c) promotion of the respect for human rights and democratisation (Denmark).

Development Assistance Committee (DAC) Department in the OECD (Organisation for Economic Co-operation and Development) that handles cooperation issues related to developing countries. DAC is responsible for coordination, integration, promoting effectiveness and providing sufficient funding for development assistance in support of sustainable economic and social development.

Development Intervention An instrument for partner (donor and non-donor) support aimed to promote development. Note: Examples are policy advice, projects, and programmes (DAC).

Development Objective Intended impact contributing to physical, financial, institutional, social, environmental, or other benefits to a society, community, or group of people via one or more development interventions (DAC).

Effect Intended or unintended change due directly or indirectly to an intervention (DAC).

Effectiveness The extent to which the development intervention's objectives were achieved, or are expected to be achieved, taking into account their relative importance (DAC).

Efficiency A measure of how economically resources/inputs (funds, expertise, time, etc.) are converted to results (DAC). Efficiency, thus, means comparing outputs to inputs (Denmark).

Evaluation The systematic and objective assessment of an on-going or completed project, programme or policy, its design, implementation and results. The aim is to determine the relevance and fulfilment of objectives, development efficiency, effectiveness, impact and sustainability (DAC).

Fiduciary risks The risk that funds are not used for intended purposes, do not achieve value for money, or are not properly accounted for.

Fungibility Financing an activity that would have been implemented anyway. Fungibility is primarily a problem of the donor, not to the recipient. A practical implication of fungibility is that the recipient country might use the donor support for financing programmes, projects or budget items, which the donor is not willing to finance.

Goal The higher-order objective to which a development intervention is intended to contribute. Related term: development objective (DAC).

Harmonisation Donor actions are more harmonised, transparent and collectively effective (Paris Declaration).

Integrated into the partner government budget Aid to the public sector channeled through the general treasury account and mixed with the partner country's domestic resources. In principle, the general treasury account includes all resources that Parliament can allocate in accordance with political priorities, laws, existing agreements, etc. The resources in the general treasury account are in all respects handled within the framework of the budget process. Among the aid modalities, only budget support corresponds to this situation.

Joint Financing Arrangement (JFA) An agreement between a number of donors and a recipient government specifying how donors may jointly finance a set of activities. Basket funding is the main type of JFA, and joint budget support may also be categorised as a JFA. Sometimes other terms are used e.g. by the Nordic+ group in its 'Guide on Joint Financing Arrangements' (will be revised during 2006).

Lead donor A donor given authority, but not formal decision-making power, to act on behalf of other donors in a sector or thematic area. A lead donor arrangement can be more or less well defined and is only sometimes described in an Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) or Terms of Reference or similar (Denmark).

Logical Framework Approach (LFA/Logframe) Management tool used to improve the design of interventions, most often at the project level. It involves identifying strategic elements (inputs, outputs, outcomes, impact) and their causal relationships, indicators, and the assumptions or risks that may influence success and failure. It thus facilitates planning, execution and evaluation of a development intervention (DAC).

Managing for Results Managing and implementing aid in a way that focuses on the desired results and uses information to improve decision-making (Paris Declaration).

Marrakech Principles An international agreement on promoting a harmonised approach to Managing for Development Results. Endorsed in March 2002 in Marrakech, Morocco.

Medium-Term Expenditure Framework (MTEF) Forward medium-term (typically three to five years) estimates of the costs (integrating recurrent and capital spending) of existing policies and proposed policy changes subjected to explicit aggregate fiscal ceilings.

Monitoring a continuing function that uses systematic collection of data on specified indicators to provide management and the main stakeholders of an ongoing development intervention with indications of the extent of progress and achievement of objectives and progress in the use of allocated funds (DAC).

Monterrey Consensus Outcome document of the International Conference on Financing for Development held in Monterrey, Mexico on 18-22 March 2002, which spelled out actions needed to promote a global partnership for development and accelerate progress towards the MDGs (<http://www.un.org/esa/ffd/aconf198-11.pdf>).

Nordic+ A group of like-minded donors (Norway, Sweden, Finland, UK, Ireland, the Netherlands and Denmark). Meets at Director General's level twice a year (together with Iceland). The group has a Joint Action Plan on harmonisation and alignment and sub-groups on a number of issues, some of which include other donors as well: procurement (includes Germany and Canada), Joint Financing Arrangements (includes Canada). Nordic+ countries work together also at country level in different and often more loosely defined groupings.

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Outcome The likely or achieved short-term and medium-term effects of an intervention's outputs (DAC).

Outputs The products, capital goods and services which result from a development intervention; may also include changes resulting from the intervention which are relevant to the achievement of outcomes (DAC).

Ownership Partner countries exercise effective leadership over their development policies and strategies and co-ordinate development actions (Paris Declaration).

Parallel aid-Aid which does not become part of the general treasury account and cannot be disbursed through the ordinary government channels through which the Ministry of Finance finances the spending units.

Paris Declaration on Aid Effectiveness An international agreement to improve aid effectiveness and be held accountable by a series of indicators and targets as a way of combating poverty in developing countries. Endorsed on 2 March 2005 at the Second High Level Forum on Aid Effectiveness (www.oecd.org/dac/effectiveness/parisdeclaration).

Partners The individuals and/or organisations that collaborate to achieve mutually agreed upon objectives (DAC).

PEFA Public Expenditure and Financial Accountability. Internationally agreed methodology for the assessment of recipient country public expenditure and financial accountability systems.

PER Public Expenditure Review. Review of policy and public expenditures, either by sector or in multiple sectors. PERs are typically carried out by or with the participation of the World Bank. A PER may also look at expenditure management systems, but this part is expected to be replaced by PEFA.

Performance The degree to which a development intervention or a development partner operates according to specific criteria/standards/guidelines or achieves results in accordance with stated goals or plans (DAC).

Performance Management Framework A framework including well-defined objectives and targets for performance management and a series of tools to be used to collect the information necessary (Denmark).

Performance measurement A system for assessing performance of development interventions against stated goals (DAC).

Performance monitoring A continuous process of collecting and analysing data to compare how well a project, program, or policy is being implemented against expected results (DAC).

Performance Review An assessment of whether a country programme and its management are on track with regard to stated goals, plans and procedures, giving recommendations on possible adjustments required. Performance Reviews are the key quality assurance instrument to assess whether PMF tools are used consistently. They are undertaken approximately every third year in all programme countries and South Africa (Denmark).

Pool(ed) funding See Basket Funding. **Programme** A time bound intervention involving multiple activities that may cut across sectors, themes and/or geographic areas (DAC). All activities supported by more than DKK 30 million (Denmark).

Programme-Based Approach An Approach based on the principle of coordinated support for a locally owned programme of development, such as a national poverty reduction strategy, a sector programme, a thematic programme or a programme of a specific organisation (Learning Network on Programme Based Approaches, definition adopted by DAC).

Programme Country A low-income country supported by Denmark through a multi-year development strategy and programme (Denmark).

Project An individual development intervention designed to achieve specific objectives within specified resources and implementation schedules, often within the framework of a broader programme (DAC). All activities supported by less than DKK 30 million (Denmark).

PIA Poverty Impact Assessment. An assessment tool developed by DAC/POVNET (may be considered a light version of PSIA).

PSIA Poverty and Social Impact Assessment. An assessment tool developed by the World Bank.

Quality assurance Quality assurance encompasses any activity that is concerned with assessing and improving the merit or the worth of a development intervention or its compliance with given standards (DAC).

Recommendations Proposals aimed at enhancing the effectiveness, quality, or efficiency of a development intervention; at redesigning the objectives; and/or at the reallocation of resources (DAC).

Reflected in the partner government budget Aid funds, which do not enter the general treasury account and therefore are not available for the decision-making of Parliament over the allocation of resources. This kind of aid can appear in the budget for information purposes only (but will still contribute to giving Parliament an overview of the total available resource envelope). Aid, which does not become part of the general treasury account may be termed "parallel aid" and cannot be disbursed through the ordinary government channels through which the Ministry of Finance finances the spending units.

Relevance The extent to which the objectives of a development intervention are consistent with beneficiaries' requirements, country needs, global priorities and partners' and donors' policies (DAC).

Results The output, outcome or impact (intended or unintended, positive and/or negative) of a development intervention (DAC).

Results-Based Management (RBM) a management strategy focusing on performance and achievement of outputs, outcomes and impacts (DAC).

Review An assessment of the performance of an intervention, periodically or on an ad hoc basis (DAC).

Review Aide Memoire Report produced after a programme review and signed by the team leader. The Review Aide Mémoire will include recommendations concerning programme adjustments, such as modifications of components, budgets and activities, as well as recommendations concerning work plans and budgets for the next year. Recommendations in the Review Aide Memoir have to be endorsed by the Steering Committee or similar body (Denmark).

Risk Analysis An analysis or an assessment of factors (called assumptions in the logframe) affect or are likely to affect the successful achievement of an intervention's objectives (DAC).

Rome Declaration An international agreement to improve donor harmonisation. Endorsed on 25 February 2003 in Rome, Italy.

Sector A coherent set of activities which can be relevantly distinguished in terms of policies, institutions and finances, and which need to be looked at together to make a meaningful assessment (Denmark).

Sector Budget Support See Budget Support

Sector Development Programme A specific, time-bound and costed set of actions and activities, which support a sector strategy (DAC).

Sector Programme Support (SPS) A long-term framework for a broader Danish assistance to a national endeavour (called a national sector programme)(Denmark).

Sector Wide Approach (SWAp) A programme-based approach operating at the level of an entire sector (DAC).

Stakeholders Agencies, organisations, groups or individuals who have a direct or indirect interest in the development intervention or its evaluation (DAC).

Sustainability The continuation of benefits from a development intervention after major development assistance has been completed (DAC).

Target Group The specific individuals or organisations for whose benefit the development intervention is undertaken (DAC).

Technical Advisory Service (TAS) The department for technical advisory services in the Danish Ministry of Foreign Affairs.

Terms of Reference (TOR) Written document presenting the purpose and scope of an assignment, the methods to be used, the resources and time allocated, and reporting requirements (DAC).

Transaction Costs The direct and indirect costs incurred by aid providers and recipients, which are specifically associated with the management of aid and the aid partnership generally. Costs may be in terms of funds, time, use of resources, efficiency losses, etc. Often, the term is used particularly about the transaction costs on the recipient side.

Validity The extent to which the data collection strategies and instruments measure what they purport to measure (DAC).

Working Party on Aid Effectiveness (WP EFF) The international grouping of donors and partner countries that oversees the implementation of the Paris Declaration. It has a number of sub-groups (Joint Ventures) on Public Financial Management, Procurement, Managing for Development Results and Monitoring the Paris Declaration.
